Appelt Aggieland Visitor Center (FR, SOPH, JR, SR)

SWE High School Conference (FR, SOPH, JR, SR)

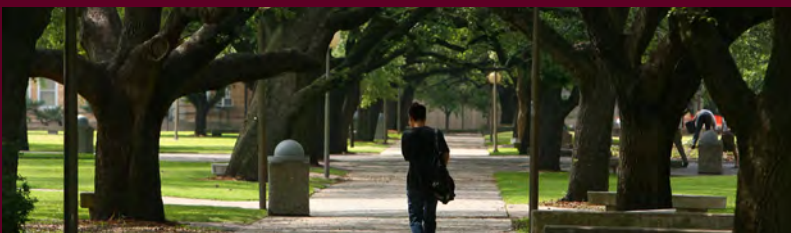
