VIPS Training

1. Sooper Puppy Training.....Tuesday, January 31
9:30 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.

You will receive training to present a five part series dealing with life lessons for **first grade** classes. It features Baxter, the "Sooper Puppy", and his friends facing dilemmas and arriving at solutions by making good choices. Issues dealing with self-esteem, thinking ahead, anger, decision making and honesty are explored. Aids such as instructions, sample questions, props and activity pages are utilized. Don't miss out on this fun and wonderful activity.

2. PIE Student Mentor Training.....Thursday, January 26

A Mentor is a suitable role model committed to serve as a guide and a friend while helping a student with his/her educational and personal development. We ask for a commitment of approximately one hour per week for the school year. The mentor will meet with the mentee only on campus and during school hours. Appointment times for the mentor and mentee to meet may be flexible and will be worked out with the campus Mentor Liaison. Along with this two hour training, an application and criminal background check are required.

3. Junior Achievement Volunteer Training.....Tuesday, January 24

Junior Achievement pairs its economic program with the Social Studies curriculum providing students examples of jobs and life skills to be successful. Volunteers from all career fields (as well as stay-at-home parents) go into the classroom to teach mini-lessons appropriate for each grade level, K-12. All materials are provided including a script for each lesson. A commitment of approximately 30 minutes each week for 5 weeks is needed to present the program to one class.

4. Galveston Bay Training.....Tuesday, February 7

Learn how to present a FUN and interactive Texas Education Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) based lesson to **4th Grade** students. Through the Galveston Bay Program, students learn about how important our bay and waterways are to them and what measures can be taken to protect this life-giving estuary.
