WHY IS THIS PROGRAM RIGHT FOR ME?

The redesign of the **Master's Degree Program in Public School Administration** makes it possible for working professionals to obtain their Master's Degree while continuing to work. This 36-hour program includes eight online classes and four hybrid classes (see proposed sequence on next page). The online courses are delivered fully online and the hybrid courses will be conducted in a combination of online and traditional face-to-face delivery. The face-to-face instruction will occur four to five Saturdays each semester. Such classes will be taught in a location within the Houston metro area. We anticipate students completing their course work and earning their **Master's Degree in Public School Administration** from Texas A&M University within two years.
