Granton Requirements

- ✓ Must have <u>26 credits</u> for the Foundation HS Plan with an endorsement.
- ✓ Must pass <u>5 STAAR EOC</u> tests to graduate: English I, Algebra I, Biology, English II and US History
- ✓ Excessive Absences (EAs) cause <u>loss of credit</u> for a course; see your AP about EAs
 - EAs will cause a student not to be classified as a sophomore
 - Students cannot get VOE forms if they have EAs

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Distinguished Level of Achievement

- Students who graduate in the top 10% of their class may gain automatic admission to Texas public colleges and universities.
 - The University of Texas will be automatically accepting the top 6% of the class of 2023.
- Under the new HB 5, to be eligible for the top 10% automatic admission students must also earn the Distinguished Level of Achievement.
- The Distinguished Level of Achievement requires:
 - 4 credits in math including Algebra II
 - 4 credits in science
 - All Foundation High School Program requirements
 - At least one endorsement

What do most colleges want?

- ✓ A rigorous, well-rounded academic program
 - 4 credits of English, 4 credits of math (including Algebra 2), and 4 credits of science (some majors include Chemistry and Physics)
 - 3 4 credits of social studies
 - 2 years of the same foreign language (some recommend 3 years)
- √ Following one's passions through electives
- ✓ Well-rounded exploration of possibilities through electives

Advanced Classes Ext Policy

- Students <u>currently in a K-level course</u>, who wish to remain K-level in the same subject, <u>must earn a 75 or higher 2nd semester</u> in that course.
- Students <u>currently in an L-level course</u>, who wish to advance into K-level in the same subject, <u>must earn a yearly average of 85 or higher</u> in that course or have scored a Level III on the EOC.
- All students must have parent permission (signature) to take advanced courses.
- If a student earns a C- at the semester or an F at any grading period, the student is removed from the K-level course and placed in the appropriate L-level course if there is one available.




We strongly suggest that students work at their personal most challenging level while maintaining a healthy life balance.

 course; therefore, course changes will not be made at the beginning of the school year.


