#### From the Nurse

All medication must be brought to the clinic by an adult. District policy does not allow students to transport medication to and from school. This includes cough drops/lozenges. Medication that is not properly checked into the clinic will be confiscated and held in the clinic and will not be administered to the student.

#### Facts of lice:

Head lice are so easily spread that anyone can get them. 6 to 12 million people will get lice each year. Most of these will be children. There is no shame because your child has head lice. Head lice are not known to transmit disease, they are just itchy and an annoyance. How are lice spread? Lice are spread by direct head-to-



head touching. They do not fly or jump, but they crawl. Children at play have closer contact than adults, so they're more likely to get lice. Head lice can be spread by sharing:

- Personal articles (clothing, combs, headbands, hats and/or scarves).
- Towels, linens, pillows, carpeting and naptime blankets.
- Stuffed toys, dolls and cloth toys.
- Earphones for a personal radio.
- Lockers or hanging clothes together on coat hooks.
- School uniforms, costumes, or gym clothes.

#### Remedies:

Home remedies do little to get rid of lice. There are several brands of lice shampoo that you can buy at the store, as well as brands that need a prescription. Talk with your own medical provider or the county health department for assistance. Shampooing the hair alone will not get rid of the lice! You must also remove all of the nits, and clean the areas of the house where the lice may be present. Cutting your child's hair or regular shampoo does little to treat lice. Clothing, bedding and household items must be cleaned to kill and remove all of the lice. Other family members need to be checked for lice, and treated if necessary.

#### **GET STARTED:**

- Visit cfisd.net/CFISDregister on your COMPUTER, SMART PHONE, or TABLET.
- Gather the documents listed on the REGISTRATION CHECKLIST. You will be asked to upload these documents for registration.
- Create a PowerSchool Enrollment account, log in and complete the online registration forms for the current school year.

#### **REGISTRATION CHECKLIST:**

- Certified copy of the child's birth certificate from the Bureau of Vital Statistics.
- Current immunization record.
- Government-issued photo ID for the child's parent or legal guardian.
- Proof of residency\* (see details below).
- Social security card for each child, if available.
- Report card or transcript from the child's last school, if available.

\*Proof of Residency: At the time of registration, parents/guardians will be asked to provide proof of residency dated within the last 30 days. Documents should reflect the parent/legal guardian's name and street address.

Please be prepared to submit one item from Line A and one item from Line B.

**Line A:** (Lessee) Verification in the form of your current lease/(Homeowner) Verification in the form of HCAD records, a mortgage statement, or closing documents.

Line B: Verification in the form of your current gas, water, or light bill.





#### **COMIENCE:**

- Visite cfisd.net/inscripcion en su COMPUTADORA, TELÉFONO o TABLETA.
- Reúna los documentos enumerados en la LISTA DE CONTROL PARA LA INSCRIPCIÓN. Se le pedirá que suba esos documentos necesarios para la inscripción.
- Abra una cuenta de inscripción en PowerSchool, inicie sesión y llene los formularios de inscripción en línea para el año escolar actual.

## LISTA DE CONTROL PARA LA INSCRIPCIÓN:

- Copia certificada del acta de nacimiento del estudiante, emitida por la Agencia de Estadísticas Vitales.
- Certificado de vacunas al día.
- Tarjeta de identificación con fotografía, emitida por el gobierno, del padre o tutor legal del estudiante.
- Comprobante de domicilio\* (vea más detalles abajo).
- Tarjeta de Seguro Social de cada niño, si la tuviesen.
- Tarjeta de calificaciones o expediente académico de la última escuela a la que asistió el estudiante, si la tiene.

\*Comprobante de domicilio: Al momento de la inscripción, se pedirá a los padres o tutores legales que presenten comprobantes de domicilio fechados dentro de un plazo de los últimos 30 días. Los documentos que se presenten deberán tener el nombre completo y la dirección del padre o tutor legal.

Esté preparado para presentar un documento de la Línea A y uno de la Línea B.

Línea A: (Inquilino) Verificación en la forma de su contrato de alquiler actual / (Propietario Verificación en la forma de los récords de HCAD, un estado de cuenta de la hipoteca o documentos de cierre.

Línea B: Verificación en la forma de su factura actual de gas, agua o electricidad.




# Sheridan Library Stars
