## Grade Classification Standards


$\checkmark 17$ credits OR If the student is on an early graduation plan
— Credits are awarded for a passing grade at the end of each semester Semester Course $=.5$ credit
Full year course $=1.0 \mathrm{credit}$

- A failing Fall semester grade CAN bridge with a passing spring semester grade to average a 70 or higher for full credit.
- A Spring semester failing grade CANNOT bridge with a passing Fall semester grade. Students MUST pass the spring semester with a 70 or higher.

## Entry

A grade of $85+$ yearly average in previous year of L-level course in same subject area or $75+$ in spring semester of K-level course

## Exit

A grade below 70 at the grading period (report card) or below 75 at semester

At the progress report grading period, a parent can request a level drop from an advanced course by providing a letterlemail directly to teacher.

## Weighted GPA on a 6.0 scale

Honor graduate designation: 6.5 - Summa cum laude 6.25 - Magna cum laude 6.0 - Cum laude

Your student's rank is how his/her GPA compares to the rest of his/her class.

Students will have first official ranking at the beginning of their JUNIOR year.

**For students to receive diploma and participate in graduation ceremony, they must complete FAFSATTASFA or opt-out form.

## Five Endorsement Areas

STEM - Science, Technology, Engineering, and advanced Math
Business \& Industry - Information Technology, database management, marketing, accounting, finance, graphic design, construction, welding, automotive technology, agriculture, hospitality \& tourism (culinary arts)

Public Service - Health Science occupations, education, human services (child guidance, cosmetology), JROTC

Arts and Humanities - Political science, literature, world languages, cultural studies, history, fine arts (Art, Dance, Music, \& Theatre)

Multidisciplinary - Provides students the opportunity to take a variety of courses from each of the other four endorsement areas

## Distinguished Level of Achievement and Performance Acknowledgements

A student must earn Distinguished Level of Achievement to be eligible for the top 10\% automatic admission program which requires:
4 credits in math, including Algebra II
4 credits in science
All Foundation High School Program requirements
At least one endorsement
A student may earn a performance acknowledgment for outstanding performance in the areas of:
Dual Credit
Bilingual/Biliteracy
College Board (AP) exams
PSAT, ACT, Aspire, SAT or ACT performance
Nationally or internationally Recognized Business or Industry Certification or License

## EOC: <br> End of Course Tests

Retest opportunities are given in December of each year.

A student must pass all 5 EOC tests to receive a diploma and participate in the graduation ceremony
