Official transcripts cost \$2 and are sent directly to the institution. Transcripts sent electronically to participating Texas colleges are free. Unofficial transcripts are \$1 and may be picked up by the student or parent in the Registrar's Office.

<u>Dual Credit</u> A dual credit PowerPoint presentation will be shared in February regarding dual credit registration. Information regarding the presentation will be shared via School Messenger. If you are interested in taking DC courses, please notify your counselor during your junior conference. Students and parents must complete a Lone Star College Registration Form to be enrolled in any DC courses.

Early Release/Late Arrival for Seniors Applications are available in the counseling office. Students must apply prior to senior year. To qualify for Early Release/Late Arrival, students need to have a job or be taking a class at the college campus, have their own transportation, be earning more credits than are needed for graduation and have passed all portions of the STAAR/EOC. When registering for classes, you must select 7 classes and will choose which to drop on the application. Eligibility for LA/ER <u>does not</u> guarantee that it will work with your schedule.

<u>College Visits</u> Students are allowed a total of four college days, two during junior year and two during senior year. Students must obtain a visitation form from the Attendance office and return the form as instructed to have the excused college day granted. *Virtual College Visit Websites:* <u>youtube.com/c/theartofcollege</u> and <u>youvisit.com/collegesearch/</u> **Early Decision vs Early Action** Early decision plans are **binding** — a student who is accepted as an ED applicant must attend the college. *Early action* plans are non-binding — students receive an early response to their application but do not have to commit to the college until the normal reply date.

<u>Pass/Fail</u> To pass/fail a course, it must be the third **elective** course in approved sequence (example: Medical Terminology, Principles of Health Science, may apply to pass/fail SPRING of Health Science Theory). Students must apply **each semester**, and pass/failing a course benefits student with a 6.0 GPA or better.

<u>Letters of Recommendation</u> Please ask recommenders at least THREE weeks in advance if they're willing to write you a letter. If you need a counselor recommendation, please provide your counselor with a completed packet found on the website https://drive.google.com/file/d/1eDfnZribEYExYZ75y8uQ7fqqEa7To46R/view. For teacher recommendations, we recommend asking teachers from your junior year who know you well. You will need to contact your teacher for the recommendation.

Financial Aid and Scholarships

- Fee waivers: If eligible, waive fees for testing (ACT/SAT) and up to four college applications. Eligibility is based on Free/Reduced lunch status. Apply for free/reduced lunch (<u>https://www.schoolcafe.com/</u>), regardless if you eat lunch on campus or not.

- FAFSA: <u>https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa</u> Financial aid application will be available October 1st, 2023 (fall of your senior year). **FAFSA completion is now a graduation requirement.** Money is first come/first serve-complete application ASAP.

<u>NCAA</u> Students will need to submit their transcript following their junior year (6th semester of high school) to the NCAA Eligibility Center in order to register. Test scores will need to be submitted as well from ACT or SAT. Please visit <u>https://web3.ncaa.org/ecwr3/</u>, there is a fee for the application process.
