# KNOW THE OPTIONS TO EARN COLLEGE CREDIT...

## DECIDE WHAT WILL WORK BEST FOR YOUR GOALS

### DUAL CREDIT COURSES

Dual Credit courses offer students the opportunity to be enrolled as a student at two institutions for the same course:

1. High School Credit on the HS transcript. These grades and credits will be included in HS credit totals and HS GPA.
2. College Credit for the enrolled course with Lone Star College. These grades and credits will be included on the Lone Star College transcript, in the Lone Star College GPA, and may be calculated in your overall College GPA.
3. Limited number of approved courses available for Dual Credit.
4. Students pay a reduced amount for Dual Credit courses, as "tuition is waived". Students pay fees EACH SEMESTER. \$73\* for 3 hour course.

### ADVANCED PLACEMENT COURSES

College Board curriculum taught throughout school year in high school AP course.

1. High School credit on the HS transcript. Grade in course will be included in credits and HS GPA.
2. College credit may be awarded by university based upon test score of 3, 4, or 5.
3. University determines which course the credit will equal and whether they will award the credit.
4. Students pay AP Exam Fee.

# Will it transfer?

**DUAL CREDIT:** *Courses transfer to the majority of universities in the U.S. and grades may be included in your overall college GPA.*

**AP:** *Credit awarded by the majority of universities in the U.S.*

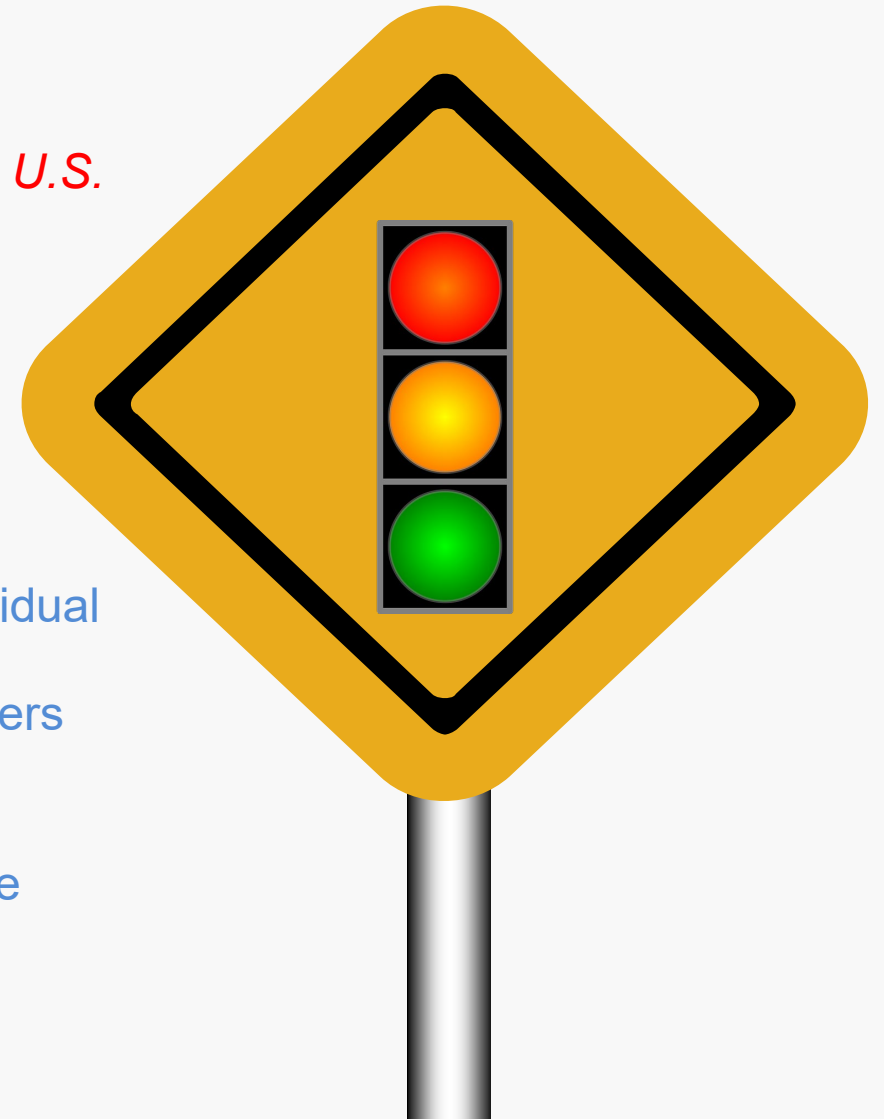

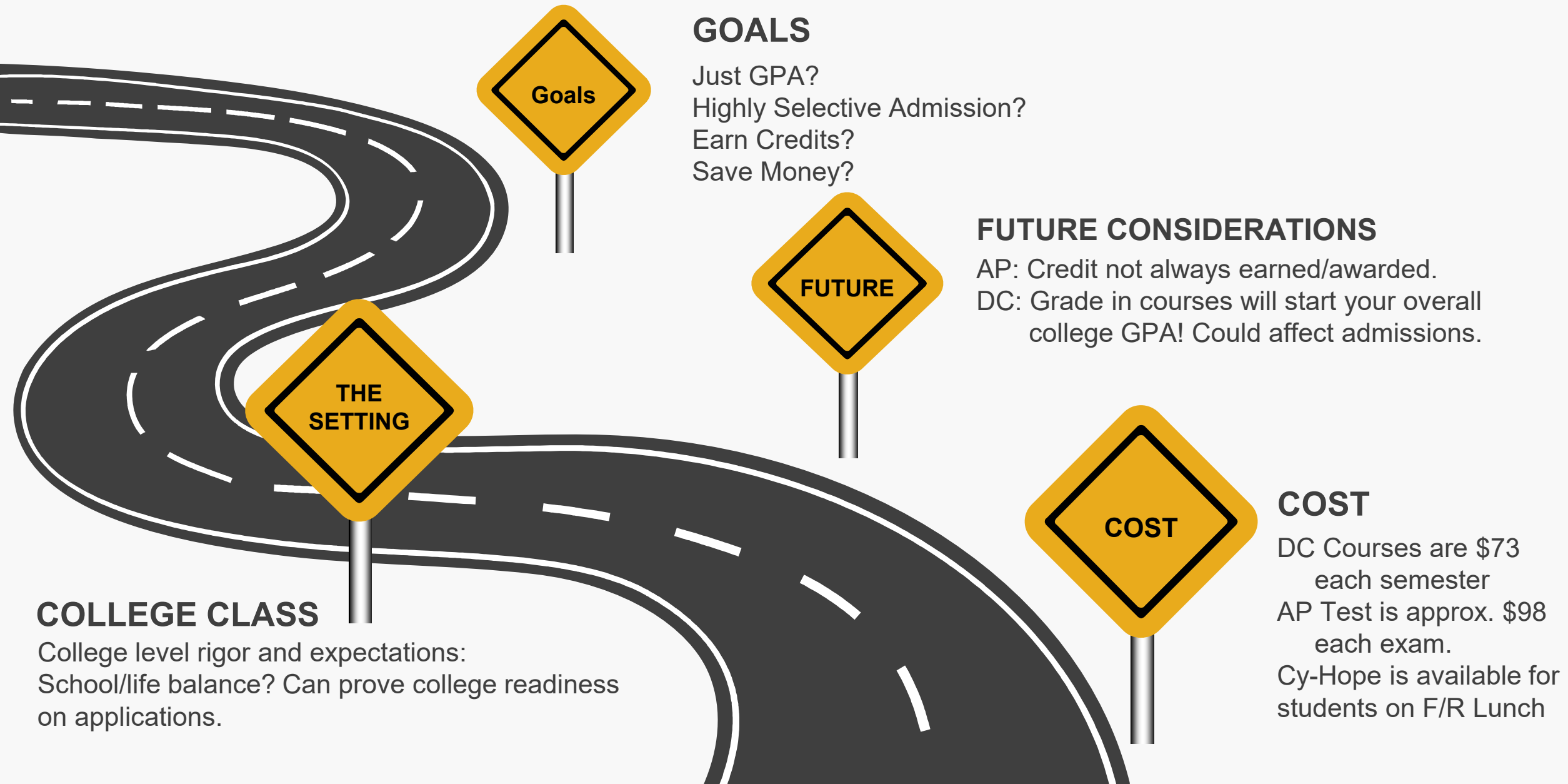

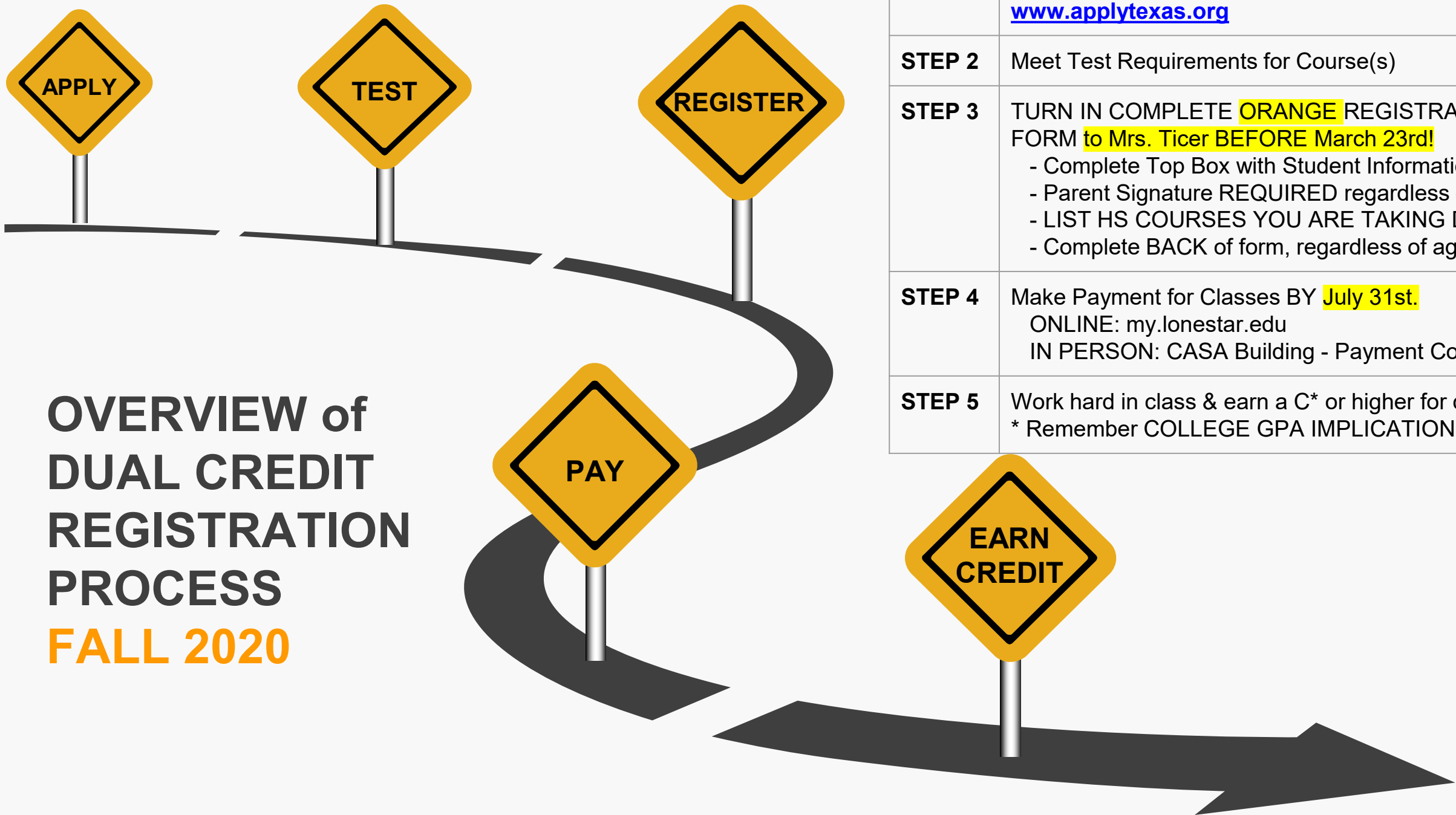

- Fee Waived for **first time**, dual-credit testers
- \$10 per section or \$29 for all three parts to re-take exam
- Computer-based and untimed
- Please allow 4-5 hours to complete the assessment (*Can divide into separate testing sessions within 13 day period*)
- Immediate results
- No wait time for Dual Credit Retesting




## ATTEND CLASS

# KNOW THE OPTIONS ...

## DECIDE WHAT WILL WORK BEST FOR YOUR GOALS

### DUAL CREDIT COURSES

Dual Credit courses offer students the opportunity to earn credit at two institutions for the same course:

1. High School Credit on the HS transcript. These credits will be included in HS credit totals and HS GPA.
2. College Credit for the enrolled course with Lone Star College. These credits will be included on the College transcript and College GPA.
3. Limited number of approved courses available for Dual Credit.
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### COLLEGE CREDIT ONLY COURSES

College Credit ONLY courses offer students the opportunity to earn College Credit for the enrolled course with Lone Star College.

1. These credits will be included on the College transcript and College GPA ONLY.
2. Courses taken with this intent will NOT meet ANY high school graduation requirements, or be included in the high school GPA.
3. ANY course at Lone Star College can be taken for College Credit only, as long as the student meets LSC requirements. (*incl. online & minimester*)
4. Registration begins with Campus DC Team.
5. ***Students pay LSC prices for all college credit only courses and are required to purchase their books.***

# Summer School Registration



## Registration Process

### Step 1

- Obtain Lone Star ID by completing online application at [www.applytexas.org](http://www.applytexas.org)
- Meet qualifying test score requirements for course(s)
- Upload Bacterial Meningitis Shot record in Magnus through your my.lonestar portal (fee)

### Step 2

- Visit LSC online catalog for Summer 2020 course offerings and times. Make note of multiple options.
- Pick up Registration Form and obtain signature from Campus Dual Credit Contact for the course(s) you intend to take in the summer
  - Take a picture of your form for your records BEFORE turning in to LSC

### Step 3

- Take your SIGNED Registration form along with a picture ID and PARENT to Lone Star Cy-Fair CASA Building for registration processing.
  - Only courses listed on the registration form will be accepted by LSC.
- Classes are offered on a first come, first served basis

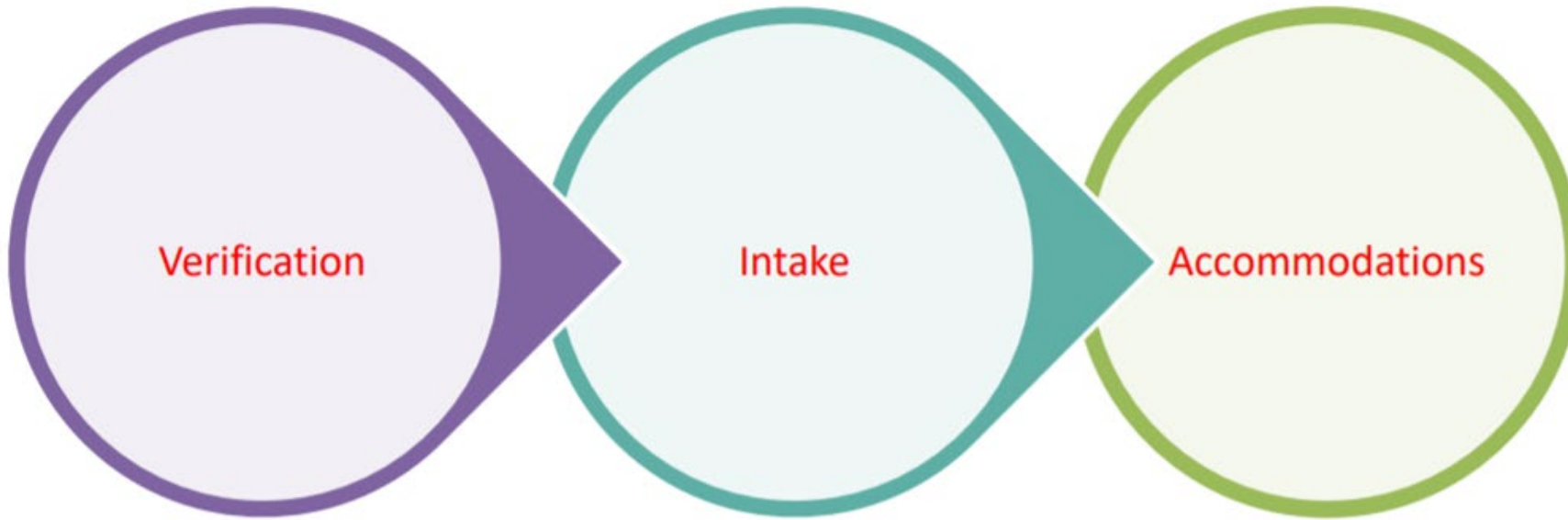
