CFEF IMPACT

- Celebrating 53 years Awards total over \$11.5 Million to 2,500+ students
- Donated approximately \$4 million for CFISD staff development programs through the Salute to the Stars Event (which started in 1998)
- Awarded \$885,700 to 143 CFISD 2023 graduating seniors
- Awards provided to students attending many colleges/universities including Lone Star College
- Scholarship / Award amounts range from \$1000 \$32,000 each
 - Minimum 3 awards per high school
- Provide financial assistance to CFISD students wanting to attend college
 - Very important that students complete the FAFSA ("Free Application for Federal Student Aid")
 form to access financial resources like Federal Pell Grants and Texas Grants
 - · Applying by Oct. 1 could provide greater opportunity to access such resources
 - Certain public universities provide tuition assistance based on economic need but FAFSA is required

- April 2024 Deadline for online application for Edwin Schroeder endowment awards
 - Awarded to CFISD senior students attending Lone Star College
 - 35-50 scholarships \$2,000 each







Goal: Use the LEAST number of application platforms to save time & effort!

Used by **ALL Texas public** 4-year institutions (some 2year) and **SOME Texas private** institutions



Used primarily by 4-year institutions. Over 800 colleges and universities across the world.



Nationwide application

used primarily by 4-year institutions. Locally--Rice, Trinity (TAMU & UT recently withdrew their apps)



Nationwide application

used to apply to more than 50 **Historically Black Colleges & Universities** (HBCUs) for a one-time application fee of \$20.











FAFSA

Free Application for Federal Student Aid

Determines how much \$ your family can reasonably be expected to contribute to your education. (Expected Family Contribution)

- Apply to at least 6 colleges so you can compare scholarship and financial aid offers.
- Take SAT/ACT even if your top colleges are Test-Optional. Some schools require scores for scholarships.
- Pay attention to deadlines!! (Materials MUST be received by deadline, but not necessarily at the same time.)
- Access unofficial transcript in HAC to accurately complete selfreported academic record (SRAR) when required.
- Essays & letters of recommendation are <u>not</u> all required by all schools. Uploading preferences vary by university.
- Be gracious, say thank you, and share the results!
- Check email/portal often. Respond to all requests for additional information immediately and keep records of your responses.
- Application fee waivers available for free/reduced lunch.

The Distinguished level of Achievement requires:


- 4 credits in math including Algebra II

Top 10% Admissions

- Automatic admission to Texas Public Institutions; UT – Top 6%
- Must submit completed application prior to deadline set by the University.
- Graduate under FHSP+E and Distinguished Level of Achievement.
- Provide additional documents required by the University.
- Admission to the University, not necessarily your specific Major.



College Visits



- You are given two days for college visits your junior year and two your senior year. They do not carry over.
- Go to the attendance office to get the proper form or in your counselor's senior schoology group
- When you visit the college of your choice, make sure you get the college to stamp the college visit form or they must give you a letter on their school letterhead.
- Return the college visit form to the attendance office within 3 days, so it does not count as an absence.

NCAA

- Students who want to play college sports should register at the beginning of their junior year
- A transcript should be sent to the Eligibility Center from the high school at the end of the junior year
- □ ACT/SAT scores no longer required for eligibility
- ☐ A minimum of 16 (Division I) or 16 (Division II) core courses must be completed by graduation
- **□** ONLINE courses are NOT ACCEPTABLE to meet core courses
- See the website for specific qualifying courses
- ☐ Coaches can help navigate the NCAA process

Early Decision vs	Early Action vs	Regular Decision
Apps typically due around Nov.	Apps due in the Fall, Decisions sent Dec – Feb.	Apps due Jan 1 – Feb 1 Decision dates vary
PROS: An early acceptance means the stressful process is over sooner! Schools know your commitment, so your chances can be slightly increased.	PROS: You'll get an early decision, but not binding. You don't need to withdraw your other applications if you're accepted. CONS:	PROS: Later deadlines mean you have longer to perfect your application and retest if needed. You aren't' committed to any school, so it's perfect if you want to keep your options open.
CONS: An acceptance is binding and you must withdraw applications from other schools. Beware of Senioritis, don't let your grades slip just because you got in early! Great choice if you have 1 Dream School	You still have to prepare your other applications, just in case the Regular Decision deadline falls right after decisions are mailed out. Do this if you love one particular school, but want to keep your options open	CONS: A large, general applicant pool = stiff competition You won't receive a decision until later, so you'll be on pins/needles for longer! Do this if you like a lot of schools, and want to weigh all of your options.

COLLEGE APPLICATION CHECKLIST

Apply early so you have enough time to review and compare scholarship and financial aid offers.

Complete the college applications and note the Priority deadline so you can be considered for scholarship opportunities.

Pay for applications.

Send test scores and official transcripts.

Request recommendation letters (if required).

Check email/status often. Respond to all requests for additional information immediately and keep records of your responses.

Letters of Recommendation

- Not necessary for most Texas colleges!
- If a letter is needed, choose someone who knows you very well Jr year teacher, counselor, employer, club sponsor, etc. ** Make personal contact with that person.
- Access and complete a <u>Student Profile</u> from your Senior Schoology course. There is the student component and equally important, the parent component.
- Turn in the completed Student Profile to the recommender.
 Recommender <u>MUST</u> be given at least 3 school weeks before letter is needed. Be aware of January deadlines as we are not in school or working over the holidays.
- Don't forget to waive your right to access your letter.
- Write a thank you note after the letter is completed.

Transcript Requests

Counselors can upload transcripts for

- Common Application
 Make sure to let your counselor know once you have submitted the common app!!!
- Apply Texas
 SARA Self-Reported Academic Record required for application no transcript required

All other transcripts must be ordered online through CFISD.net

First 5 Free

Electronic Transcripts = FREE
(For Texas schools accepting electronic transcripts)

Allow at least 3 days for processing of transcripts

Lone Star College Transcripts

- Students who take dual-credit courses may be required to provide official Lone Star transcript(s) to colleges and universities where they apply.
- Please check with the college where you are applying to confirm.
- Transcripts must be requested online.

What options are there to help pay for college?

Financial Aid

FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) –Financial aid application for U.S. citizens and eligible residents. Must be completed to receive federal grants and loans. Graduation requirement.

TASFA (Texas Application for Student Financial Assistance) – Financial aid application for students who are state residents but not U.S. citizens.

Some scholarship committees may require financial aid information before awarding scholarships.

Prior to December 1st, apply for an FSAID number. For the 2024-2025 FAFSA, you will use 2022 tax information.

Money is awarded on a first come, first served basis.

Kinds of Financial Aid

- Merit Based Aid: Academics, Skills, Fine Art, University scholarships
- Need Based Aid: Grants & Scholarship Funds are given as a gift which does not have to be repaid
- Loans Funds have to be repaid with interest
- Work Study Funds earned on an hourly basis for campus jobs
