Welcome to the Cypress Woods Testing page! My name is Karen Payne, and I am the Cy Woods Testing Coordinator. I oversee STAAR EOC, PSAT, and School Day SAT testing. I also manage EOC testing exemptions for students who earn course credit at an out of state or private school.

STAAR END-OF-COURSE (EOC) EXAM REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION

- STAAR EOC Courses: Algebra I, Biology, English I, English II, and US History
- Students who earn credit from a public, Texas school must pass the corresponding STAAR EOC exam for purposes of graduation.
 - A STAAR EOC exam does not impact course averages or course credits.
- STAAR EOC course credits earned at institutions away from public, Texas schools (such as private schools and out of state schools) are exempt from the STAAR EOC exam graduation requirement.

STAAR END-OF-COURSE (EOC) EXAM REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION

- Students who earned credit for a STAAR EOC course during Spring/Summer 2020 were awarded a COVID-19 waiver for the corresponding STAAR EOC exam as state assessments were cancelled.
- Students typically participate in STAAR EOC exams in the spring semester as they are finishing a course.
 - Additional testing opportunities are available for students who are absent/unsuccessful in summer (June) and fall (December) each year. The STAAR EOC exam schedule is set by the state.

STAAR END-OF-COURSE (EOC) EXAM MODE CHANGE

- Beginning in the 2022-2023 school year, the STAAR testing program (including EOC exams) moved to computer-based exams.
- CFISD students will test using their CFISD Chromebook.
- Beginning in the 2022-2023 school year, the time limits on STAAR Assessments, including EOC exams, were removed.
- Ensure your child brings their fully charged Chromebook and charger to school each day. Getting into the habit now will mean your child has the tools needed on test days. Chromebook and charger to school each day.

"When you're home, charge your Chrome!"

PSAT/NMSQT

- PSAT (and SAT) are going digital.
 - PSAT Fall 2023 and forward will be fully digital
 - SAT Spring 2024 and forward will be fully digital
- Students will test on their CFISD Chromebook using an app by College Board called Bluebook.
- Students who participate in October PSAT testing should receive notification of score availability via the e-mail address they provide during testing. Scores should be available by November 6^{th.}
- This notification e-mail should provide details regarding how to set up a College Board account so that scores can be accessed. If your child already has a College Board account and provides the same e-mail address during October testing, the scores should be available in their account by November 6th.
- Regretfully, Cy Woods is unable to assist with College Board accounts.

SCHOOL DAY SAT TESTING

- Cy Woods Juniors will participate free of charge in School Day SAT testing on March 6, 2024.
- This is not a practice test or a field test. Scores from this test can be used for college admission, financial aid, and scholarship opportunities.
- Students who have participated in PSAT testing in the past can link their College Board account to their Khan Academy account for personalized test prep based on their PSAT scores. (Directions are posted on the Cy Woods Testing Page under Khan Academy.)
- While this service is available now to students who took PSAT during the Fall 2022 school year, students wishing to prepare for the School Day SAT should wait until October 2023 PSAT scores post in their College Board account for more accurate practice.

Class Rank and GPA

- Class rank and GPA are reported on student transcripts
- GPA is determined by semester averages and is cumulative
- GPA is run one time per year at the end of the summer for grades 9, 10 and 11
- The GPA and rank from the end of junior year will be used when applying to colleges
- Senior ranking is performed at the end of the first semester and after the third grading period (to identify honor graduates, who will wear honor cords, and graduation walk order only)



WHAT IS PASS/FAIL?

- CFISD encourages students to pursue areas of special talents and aptitude, while not impacting their GPA with on-level grade points
- Available to juniors and seniors in areas of study that are beyond requirements for graduation (GPA must include at least 26 credits)
- Maximum benefit obtained by students who have more K-level than on-level courses on their final transcript, AND
- Earns mostly A's in all courses of study (has a GPA of 6.0 or higher)



PASS/FAIL COURSES

- Must meet all graduation requirements to qualify
- Application due within the first 8-10 days of semester
- 3rd or 4th year course in a four-year elective program (Ex: Athletics III; Band IV)
- Limited to two credits total (one in 11th grade, one in 12th grade)
- Students receive a number grade on their report card for each grading period. This may impact honor roll
- Grade not calculated in GPA or class rank
- Transcript shows a "P" or "F"



FINAL EXAM EXEMPTION POLICY UPDATE

- Exam exemptions are a behavior and attendance incentive. To qualify, students must meet the following criteria:
 - five or fewer absences
 - three or fewer tardies
 - an average of 75 or higher for the semester
 - an E, S, or I in conduct
 - no OSS, ALC, or JJAEP Placement
 - no fees or fines
- The Assistant Principal's office handles exemptions.

EARNING COLLEGE CREDIT IN HIGH SCHOOL

Dual Credit

- Through Lone Star College
- Must meet CFISD and Texas college qualification standards
- Two-part registration process will begin in March for the 24-25 school year
- Credit earned by successful completion of the course with a C or better
- AP
 - Selected during course registration
 - Must meet CFISD advanced course entry criteria
 - AP exam score and college policies determine credit(s) earned

AP EXAMS

Two-step process for registering and paying for AP exams:

Step 1 - REGISTERING:

Create a CollegeBoard account at

https://myap.collegeboard.org/login. Students will then register for AP exams they plan on taking.

Step 2 - PAYING:

Create an account at <u>www.totalregistration.net/AP/443302</u>. **Students will then select and pay for the AP exams they plan on taking. Student should receive a confirmation page stating they have selected and paid for their AP exams.**



AP EXAMS

- Students who are not in an AP class but want to take an AP test, must stop by the Counselors'
 Office for information on registering as an independent for the "exam only" section.

- Check the college website for additional application requirements, scholarships, and due dates!
- All students (including top 10%) must complete applications and send their transcripts and test scores.



COLLEGE APPLICATION TIPS

- Complete and submit all application requirements by the due date
- Create a professional-sounding email account for college application correspondence
- Check e-mail/portals often for notices regarding your application status
- Print or photocopy all information sent to a college
- Contact testing agency (CollegeBoard and ACT) to send test scores directly to each college
- Be conservative when posting on social media



TOP 10% RULE

- Public universities and colleges in Texas automatically admit students in the top 10% of their graduating class
 - EXCEPTION: University of Texas at Austin admits the top 6% of freshmen applicants through spring of 2024.
- Students are not guaranteed a specific major
- Check university websites for admissions policies for applicants not in the top 10% of their graduating class.

LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

- If a letter of recommendation is required, complete the Wildcat Resume
 - https://sites.google.com/cfisd.net/stephanieengland/wildcat-resume
- Request letters from professionals who know you well
 - Teachers and coaches are the best resources, as they can speak to your academic and athletic accomplishments
- Allow 3 weeks for letters to be completed
- Letters will be mailed or uploaded directly from the school
- Check applications and websites for due dates

- Must be sent directly from the Registrar's Office or ordered online at:
 - https://cypressfairbankskl2.scriborder.com/
- Pricing:
 - If sent electronically = Free
 - If sent by mail = \$2.00 each
 - Unofficial = \$1.00
- Order forms are available in the Registrar's Office



SPECIAL EVENTS ON COLLEGE CAMPUSES

- Many schools offer special weekend events for prospective students.
- Schools will keep track of students who visit their campus.
- Students who show an active interest in a college may receive extra consideration in the admissions process.
- Check websites of the universities that you are interested in for special events.
- Some of the larger colleges have Houston-area regional offices; check with your college of interest for more information.



COLLEGE VISITATION DAYS

- Two (2) days allowed during the junior and senior year
 - Unused days from junior year do not roll-over
- Days do not count against exemptions or attendance

FINANCIAL AID FOR COLLEGE

FAFSA – Free Application for Federal Student Aid

- All <u>seniors</u> must complete the FAFSA, TASFA, or submit an opt-out form, to meet graduation requirements
- FAFSA opens on or near **December 1**st
- Be sure to complete the application for the year you will start college, NOT the current school year (2023-2024)
 - Opt-out form located in the counseling office and the TEA website
- University based scholarships, work-study, parent loans, and student loans all require FAFSA results
- Apply early first come/first served

SCHOLARSHIPS

HELPING YOUR WILDCAT


