- **Celebrating 53 years - Awards total over \$11.5 Million to 2,500+ students**
- **Donated approximately \$4 million for CFISD staff development programs through the Salute to the Stars Event (which started in 1998)**
- **Awarded \$885,700 to 143 CFISD 2023 graduating seniors**

 - Requires Lone Star College attendance
- **April 2024** - Deadline for online application for Edwin Schroeder endowment awards
 - Awarded to CFISD senior students attending Lone Star College

4 YEAR COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY

- SAT or ACT recommended to complete an application
- See individual websites for admissions requirements

2 YEAR COLLEGE

- No SAT or ACT required but recommended; open admission
- Transfer after meeting minimum university requirements using college GPA.
- Certificate/licensure programs

CAREER & TECHNICAL TRAINING

- Specific industry (automotive, culinary, dental assistant, etc.)
- Two Year Colleges offer Workforce Programs with technical training/licenses/certifications

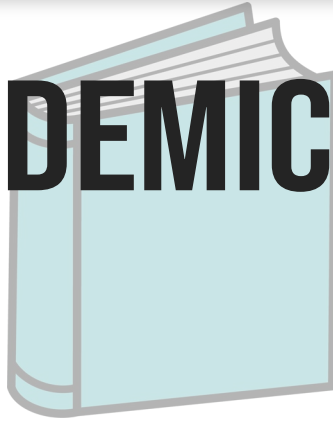

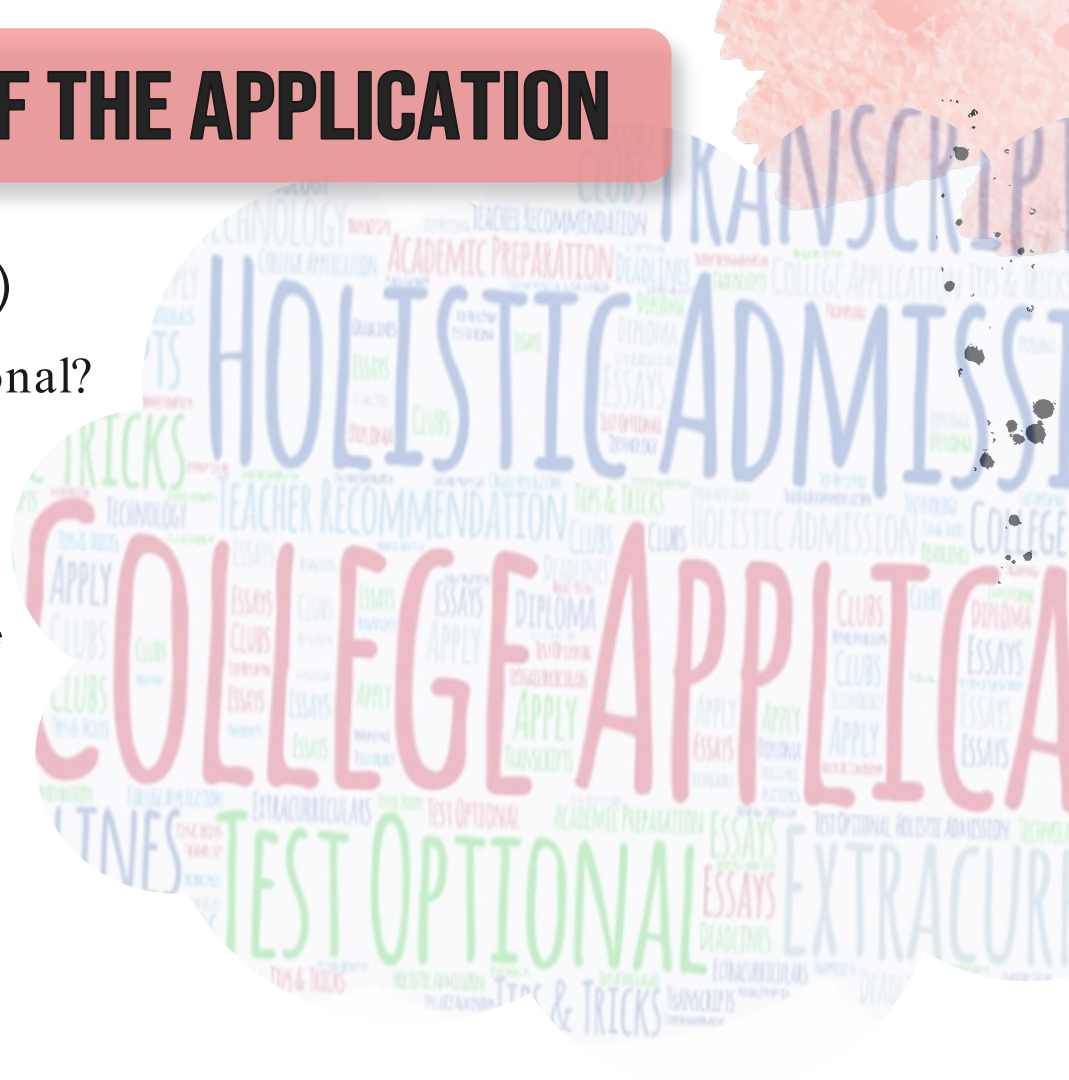

Students receive two EXACT class ranks for college applications:

1. **NOW:** The first class rank is calculated with semester averages through the end of the junior year.
2. **JANUARY** The second class rank is calculated to include the first semester of the senior year.

GPA to determine honor graduates for graduation will be calculated after the 3rd nine weeks of the senior year.

AUTOMATIC ADMISSIONS

AUTOMATIC ADMISSION TO TEXAS PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS FOR STUDENTS WHO GRADUATE IN THE TOP 10%.

EXCEPTION : UT AUSTIN FOR THE CLASS OF 2024 = TOP 6%

- Must submit completed application prior to deadline set by the university
- Apply no later than 2 years after graduating from high school
- Graduate under Foundation Plan + Endorsement
- Provide additional documents required by the university

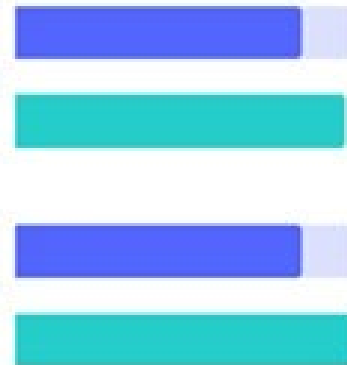

HOW ARE YOU GOING TO APPLY?

EARLY DECISION

- Understand that you are **COMMITTING** to enroll at that university if they accept you.
- Apply to **ONLY ONE** university through Early Decision I.
- Do not apply Early Decision if finances are a factor in your decision. Choose another admission category.
- Parent **MUST** sign a contract committing to the university.

EARLY ACTION

- Early Action allows applicants to receive their admission decisions “early.”
- Does **NOT** commit student to attend the university if accepted.
- Can apply to multiple schools through Early Action.
(unless university identifies as Single-Choice Early Action)

REGULAR DECISION

- Applicants will receive notification during “regular” admissions processes.
- Final Deadline for applications to be submitted.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

- Think specifics:

 - Weeks per year

- Make a list of activities **BEFORE** you sit down to complete application.
- Volunteer Hours:
 - Church/Religious Service
 - Club Organizations
 - Any assistance given for which you were not paid

IF YOU ARE NOT ABLE TO FIT ALL ACTIVITIES, THEN IT IS APPROPRIATE TO UPLOAD A RESUME IF THE COLLEGE/UNIVERSITY ALLOWS.

ESSAYS

TEST OPTIONAL APPLICATION ESSAYS CARRY MORE WEIGHT.

Not all schools require an essay.

- Do research.
- If not required, many schools will accept an essay.
- If it says, "essay optional" **DO IT!**

Make it personal.

- The essay is the only place on the college application where the admissions committee "gets to know you personally."
- Do not write an impersonal essay.
Share stories, significant experiences, what makes you **"YOU!"**
- Each essay should reveal a different experience/aspect of who you are.
- DO not REPEAT yourself.

TRANSCRIPTS

- Best Practice ~~AFTER~~ submitting the application: **Order a Transcript**

(To order a transcript, please use the QR code or bit.ly website on the REGISTRAR'S window to request a transcript sent to the university.)



Official Transcript – must allow **THREE DAYS** for processing:

- T-rex Schools (public, in Texas) = electronic submission – Free
- Out-of-state or Private: Mailed to the university/organization – up to \$5
- Mailing Address of University Required

Unofficial Transcript – For student personal use or to help fill out application

NOTE: Dual Credit Students: Send Lone Star Transcript through myLoneStar
(only send if required for admission otherwise wait until

acceptance)

ADMISSION DECISIONS

WHEN WILL I RECEIVE MY DECISION?

- **Automatic Admits & “Assured Admission” Admits**
Students receive acceptance notice QUICKLY.
- **Rolling Admission**
Some schools send letters periodically to “automatic admission” students or reviewed students
- **Early Decision Admissions**
Students that apply to schools that officially offer “early admissions” typically receive notification by January.
- **Regular Decision/Admissions (majority of schools)**
Admission decisions sent February-April

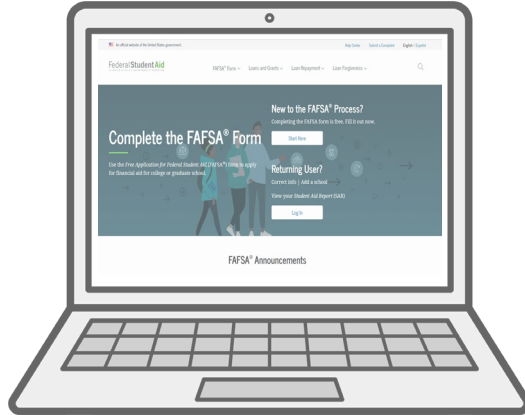
