FUTURE OPTIONS... WHICH EDUCATION SETTING DO YOU NEED TO PURSUE TO ACCOMPLISH YOUR GOALS?

Career Training Program

- 🗶 Apprenticeship Programs
 - Start Working immediately
 - Attend class 1–2 times per week in the evening.
- **✗** Specialty / Trade School
 - often private/for profit programs. (more \$\$\$)
 - Example: UTI/MIAT, ARC Labs, Paul Mitchell School, PIMA Medical Institute
- ✗ Workforce Program at a Two Year College
 - often cheaper. IndustryCertification or Applied Assoc.
 - Lone Star College

Associate Degree

- Earn a 2 year Degree to go to workforce or complete a two year certification
- Complete the two year degree and then transfer to a 4 year University
- Earn credits for less than a full Associate Degree and transfer credits after a year (once you meet transfer requirements of university)

Bachelors Degree

✗ Typically completed in 4-5 years.

Select an area to specialize in and declare a "Major" you want to earn a degree in.

OPTIONS TO EARN COLLEGE CREDIT

(keep in mind when selecting Senior classes)

ADVANCED PLACEMENT PROGRAM

- Receive college credit through AP Exam score
- EXAM SCORE = SPECIFIC CREDIT AWARDED VARIES BY COLLEGE
- RIGOROUS CURRICULUM: REQUIRES SERIOUS COMMITMENT
- Must meet grade criteria to take AP courses
- Sign up during your Junior Conference

DUAL CREDIT PROGRAM

INFO/REGISTRATION MTG: FEBRUARY 21 6:00PM IN LCHS AUDITORIUM

- EARN BOTH HIGH SCHOOL AND COLLEGE CREDIT THROUGH LONE STAR COLLEGE CY-FAIR GRADE IN THE COURSE EARNS CREDIT
- Courses taken on high school or college campus
- Must meet testing requirements to qualify
- Accepted at most colleges/universities Across the nation!
- LSC <u>Dual Credit REGISTRATION</u> DEADLINE MAY 3RD

WHAT IS ASSURED ADMISSIONS?

Many universities have "assured" admission programs that guarantee admission to the university, if a certain criteria is met.

These charts are typically listed on their admission websites under requirements.

See University of Houston Example:

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Choose to submit your application with a test score or without. If you apply with test scores, we will only use the highest total or composite score from one sitting. UH does not superscore.

ADMISSION PRIORITIES VARY



Liberal Arts schools typically encourage students to study broadly, so they may give more weight to factors such as essays or demonstrated interest.



Highly selective schools attract THOUSANDS of outstanding students. They typically look at "unique contributions" exceptional factors to make their decision. Look for themes on website to find priorities.



Large (public) universities may make their admission decision solely based on Class Rank, GPA and/or Test scores.

1 - 2 School

- School that has your major
- May be out of your academic profile, but you have ALWAYS dreamed of attending there...
 your #1 Choice!

the Mid-Range

2-4 Schools

- Like the Campus/School. Would be happy to attend.
- School that has your major
- You meet the middle 50% academic GPA and Test Scores (even if towards bottom)
- · Good Match financially.

the Foundation

- You KNOW you will get in 100%.
- School has your major
- Financial Match
- Guaranteed option

1 School

Students applying to Highly Selective Universities (any school with acceptance rate of less than 25%) or Programs are recommended to apply to more than 5

COLLEGE VISITS - CFISD PROCEDURE

STUDENTS ARE ALLOWED A TOTAL OF 4 COLLEGE VISIT DAYS:

- 2 DAYS DURING JUNIOR YEAR
- 2 DAYS DURING SENIOR YEAR
- •Must get form from Attendance Office <u>before</u> taking a college day
- •DURING VISIT, GET OFFICIAL SIGNATURE AND RETURN FORM TO AP
- •IF TAKING 2 COLLEGE DAYS TOGETHER FOR TRAVELLING PURPOSES, TALK WITH AP PRIOR TO COLLEGE VISIT

PREPARE FOR LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

- For counselor recommendations: Complete "Student Request for Recommendation" form and questionnaire
- REQUEST MUST BE RECEIVED 3 WEEKS PRIOR TO DATE NEEDED
- INCLUDE YOUR RÉSUMÉ WITH YOUR REQUEST
- If using the Common Application the "school report" is completed by your counselor


GET A HEAD START ON YOUR COLLEGE APPLICATIONS - GET ORGANIZED THIS SPRING

- If applying to a Service Academy, begin your application this spring.

ADMISSION

SAT and ACT Scores help to identify academic ability

Some schools have an "Assured Admission" that guarantees students admission to the university if they meet the listed requirements. These are solely based upon:

Class Rank/GPA & Test Scores

SCHOLARSHIPS

Many universities offer Academic Scholarships based upon test scores. These are often "automatically" awarded if students qualify.


COLLEGE READINESS

In Texas, students must meet minimum scores on college entrance exams to prove they are prepared to be academically successful in the college classroom.

Students can use SAT, ACT, or the TSI test to meet requirements.

WHAT IS TEST OPTIONAL?

WHEN SAT OR ACT SCORES ARE NOT REQUIRED FOR ADMISSIONS, BUT CAN BE SUBMITTED.
