Financial Assistance during COVID-19:

<u>United Way (211):</u> Gives callers information on how to pay their utility bills, rent, and mortgages, and to locate food pantries, senior services, and unemployment help.

<u>Family Houston (713.869.484 or family@familyhouston.org)</u>: Family Houston is helping families find food assistance, through the Houston Food Bank and school programs, public benefits and unemployment assistance, access healthcare, and providing mental health services.

<u>The Gulf Coast Community Services Association:</u> provides assistance with short term help on bills and expenses like rent, mortgage, prescriptions, and transportation.

<u>The City of Houston:</u> will not disconnect water service through April to customers who are behind on payments.

Bank of America: will let homeowners and car owners take a few months off of paying their mortgages during the coronavirus outbreak, but payments will be added at the end of your loan to not hurt your credit.

<u>Capital One, Chase, Citibank, Trust, U.S. Bank, and Wells Fargo:</u> will offer mortgage holders deferments or payment options on a case-by-case basis.

<u>Hyundai, Ford, Nissan, Toyota, Lexus, General Motors, and BMW:</u> will offer payment deferments up to six months, but you must contact them and options are on a case-by-case basis.
