ORIGINAL CREDIT and MATH ACCELERATION COURSES

Registration

- Registration is based on current 2020-2021 grade levels.
- See **Important Dates** on the next page relating to registration.
- Students must have approval from their grade-level counselor before signing up for original-credit courses.
- Only CFISD students may register for middle school summer school.
- Contact your child's counselor for registration information. Registration begins April 19 and ends May 7.

Credits

Students may earn $\frac{1}{2}$ L-level (on-level) credit each session for original credit courses. **To get credit for the course, students may not be absent more than 2 days during each session. Reminder: One day in summer school equals seven days in the regular school term.**

Original Credit Course Offerings

Students must be eligible to take a course during the 2021-2022 school year in order to enroll in an original-credit course in the summer. Only the courses listed on this page will be offered for original credit. If fewer than 20 students enroll in a course, students will be notified and can change their course selection or attend another campus.

² Students must complete the full course in summer school; therefore, they must enroll in both summer sessions.

Math Acceleration Courses

Students must make 1) an 85+ yearly average in an on-level math course or score *Masters Grade level* on STAAR Math in order to take math acceleration courses and 2) earn a final grade of 80+ in the summer course in order to be placed in K-level math for 2021-2022. Should a student not earn the required 85+ yearly math average, they will be removed from the summer acceleration course. **Registration for the Math Acceleration program ends on the home campus on May 7th. Students must attend the last day of the summer school course and take the final exam.**

Considerations

- ♦ Summer school course curriculum is fast-paced, compacted, and accelerated. Students who typically need extra time to read, research, or complete a project or an assignment may encounter challenges. The compacted nature of summer school provides no opportunity for tutorials.

MAKE-UP CREDIT

Registration

- Registration is based on current 2020-2021 grade levels.
- See **Important Dates** below relating to registration.
- Students should register as early as possible to reserve space in a class.
- Only CFISD students may register for middle school summer school.
- Contact your child's counselor for registration.

Credits

Students may take two make-up credit courses, one in Session I and one in Session II. **To get credit for the course, students may not be absent more than 2 days during each session. Reminder: One day in summer school equals seven days in the regular school term.**

Course Offerings

A course will be offered for make-up credit if it meets the minimum enrollment requirement (20 students). If fewer than 20 students enroll in a course, students will be notified and can change their course selection, attend another campus

ENRICHMENT COURSES

Self paced Enrichment courses in Math and Reading will be available through Schoology and Edgenuity. These courses are designed for students who would benefit from a review of the current course content. Registration will be submitted through a Google link shared by the home campus. Families without internet access may contact their child's counselor to register.

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GENERAL INFORMATION

Attendance and Absences

- Prompt arrival and daily attendance are mandatory for academic success in summer school. The following provision is made, however, in case of student illness or emergencies: A student absent from class because of illness or family emergency should bring:
 - *On Campus Students* - an explanatory note signed by the parent and check in through the principal's office upon his/her return to school.
 - *Online Students* – parent should submit an email to the summer school principal.
- Students who are absent from class **for more than two days for any reason** during either session will be withdrawn and **no credit granted**. This applies to both original-credit, acceleration and make-up credit courses. Being absent for two days of summer school is comparable to being absent 14 days during the regular term.
- **Three tardies in any class will count as one day of absence.** A tardy will be assessed for late arrival in the morning and for late arrival following the lunch period and breaks; however, **students arriving 15 or more minutes late in the morning will be marked absent ½ day.**

Online Class Expectations

- Online students follow the same attendance criteria as on-campus students.
- Students attending online classes will be expected to have devices fully charged or connected to a power source.
- Students should enter the Zoom meeting, with class materials, promptly at the beginning of class and when returning from breaks. Tardies will be counted.
- The device camera should be on and students' faces visible.
- Students must be connected to the class for the entirety of the class period or as directed by the teacher. (7 hours for OC, ACC courses and 6 hours for make-up credit courses)

Final Exam Exemption

Middle school students who are taking high school courses for **original credit** may be granted exemptions for final exams if they have no absences and/or tardies.

Summer School Sites

- Students from Aragon, Dean, Hopper, Kahla, Labay, Rowe, Thornton, Truitt, and Watkins **will attend Kahla Middle School.**
- Students from Anthony, Arnold, Bleyl, Campbell, Cook, Goodson, Hamilton, Salyards, Smith and Spillane **will attend Spillane Middle School.**

Transportation

- Parents must assume responsibility for their child's transportation to summer school. No busses will be provided.

Student Dress and Discipline

- The Code of Conduct and dress code rules followed during the regular school term are in effect for summer school.
- Both on campus and online students are expected to comply with the dress code.
- Unacceptable behavior will result in a student's immediate dismissal from summer school.

Tutorials

No tutorials are provided for summer school.

Food Service

Breakfast will be served at 7:15 a.m. each day. Students will have lunch between 11:30 a.m. and 12:45 and will be able to purchase a lunch in the cafeteria.

Report Cards

Report cards for both summer sessions will be printed and mailed at the end of Session II only.

Tuition

2021 Summer School is tuition free. Only current Cypress-Fairbanks students may register for middle school summer school in CFISD.
