Lunch Visitors

Two (2) adult visitors per student one time per week will be



allowed in for lunch. Reminder: only parents/guardians may visit for lunch at this time (no younger siblings).

Parents/Guardians may bring food and beverages for their child, but they <u>may not</u> bring food/drinks for other children. Many parents/guardians treat their children to

special lunches from outside restaurants occasionally. While we encourage you to reward your children with these special celebrations, we ask that if you are bringing your child lunch that you arrive on time. To protect instructional time, any student waiting on a parent/guardian ten minutes after lunch has begun will be sent through the cafeteria line.

If you wish to purchase extra items such as ice cream or cookies your child must have money on their lunch account. If you need to speak to the cafeteria you can reach the Warner Elementary Cafeteria Manager, Damarys Medal at 281-213-1663.

House Bill 114 (<u>HB 114</u>)

This summer the 88th Texas Legislature passed House Bill 114 (HB 114) in response to the growing concerns surrounding e-cigarettes and vaping among young people. This law mandates that any student found in possession of, using, selling, giving, or delivering an **e-cigarette** (a vape device) on school premises or at any school-affiliated event must receive a discipline consequence at the District's Alternative Learning Center (ALC). Cypress-Fairbanks ISD will make necessary adjustments to the Student Code of Conduct in order to comply with this new law.



How this might impact your student:

- If your student possesses an e-cigarette (even if it contains nothing) or any component, part or accessory for any vaping device while on school grounds or at a schoolrelated event, they will be recommended for a mandatory placement at the ALC for at least 10 days for first-time ecigarette offenses.
- 2. It is important to note your student assumes responsibility for any item knowingly within their possession, even if it is not their own.
- When at the ALC, your student is not able to participate in any school activities. Furthermore, they may face removal from specific student clubs or organizations as stipulated by each organization's rules and regulations.
- 4. Students with ALC placements do not qualify for final exam exemptions for that school year.
- 5. Modified bus transportation is provided to the Alternative Learning Centers but is not provided to the elementary Special Opportunity School.

Parent/Guardian's next steps:

- 1. Please talk with your student to ensure they are informed about the new law.
- 2. Prompt your student to be aware of the contents of their backpack, vehicle, and personal belongings.
- Remind your student not to allow friends to store prohibited items, such as e-cigarettes, in their backpack or vehicle, and discourage them from holding such items on behalf of others.
- 4. Talk with your student regarding the adverse health effects of vaping. We have shared resources below to help you start the conversation.

News from the Cafeteria



To determine eligibility for free or reducedprice meals for the 2023-2024 school year, families with students who do not attend a Eligibility Provision Community (CEP) campus will need to complete a Free & Reduced Meal Application. Applications must be completed each school year to determine eligibility.

View the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Child Nutrition Programs Income Eligibility Guidelines. The Texas Department of Agriculture (TDA) administers school nutrition programs in Texas and offers an eligibility calculator on the Square Meals Online Program Eligibility Form.

Please note that students who are attending a USDA designated Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) campus during the 2023-2024 school year will receive free meals and are not required to complete a Free and Reduced Meal Application. Information about the USDA CEP program and eligible Cy-Fair ISD campuses is posted on the CEP page.

- After you log in, on the left side under 'Benefits', click 'Apply'.

Visitors and Raptor 6

All visitors to the school will be checked into the building in two ways:



- All visitors will be required to use the Raptor 6 (this requires a valid driver's license/photo identification).
- All visitors' identification will be matched with our school information (as provided by the parent on the emergency contact card).

If individuals other than the parent/guardian are coming for lunch or to attend an event, we must receive a written note from the parent/guardian. If we do not receive a written note, the visitor will not be permitted to enter the building. if you know an individual is coming to have lunch at school or attend an event, it is important that:

- 1. The parent accompanies the visitor.
- 2. The parent provide written notification to the front office prior to the visit.
