

CFISD Teacher Prep I (Instructional Practices)

Scope and Sequence

Course Description:

This course is a field-based internship that provides students with background knowledge of child and adolescent development as well as principles of effective teaching and training practices. Students work under the joint direction and supervision of both a teacher with knowledge of early childhood education and exemplary educators or trainers in direct instructional roles with elementary students. Students learn to plan and direct individualized instruction and group activities, prepare instructional materials, develop materials for educational environments, assist with record keeping, and complete other responsibilities of teachers, trainers, paraprofessionals, or other educational personnel. Standard professional dress is required when on “cooperating” school campuses. (2 credits)

- Grades 11-12
- Recommended prerequisites: Principles of Education and Training or Principles of Human services and Child Development or Communication and Technology in Education
- Satisfies advanced course requirement for Public Services endorsement
- Seniors receive CFISD Letter of Intent to Interview upon successful completion of program.
- Lab/uniform fee may be required
