 - o Maintenance & Operations (M&O) Tax rate at \$1.06 in 2018; reduced to \$0.97 in 2019, reduced to .9555 in 2020, reduced to .9292 in 2021, and reduced to .8948 in 2022
- 20% Local Optional Homestead Exemption plus \$40,000 state exemption
- Bond referendums:
 - o 2019: \$1.762 billion the largest bond election in the district's history
 - o 2014 \$1.209 billion; 2007 \$806 million; 2004 \$713.2 million
- Administrative expenditures account for only 1.79% of the operating budget; Among the lowest administrative cost ratio (3.67%) in the Gulf Coast region for more than a decade and one of the lowest in the state
 - o Operating cost is \$9,834 per student
