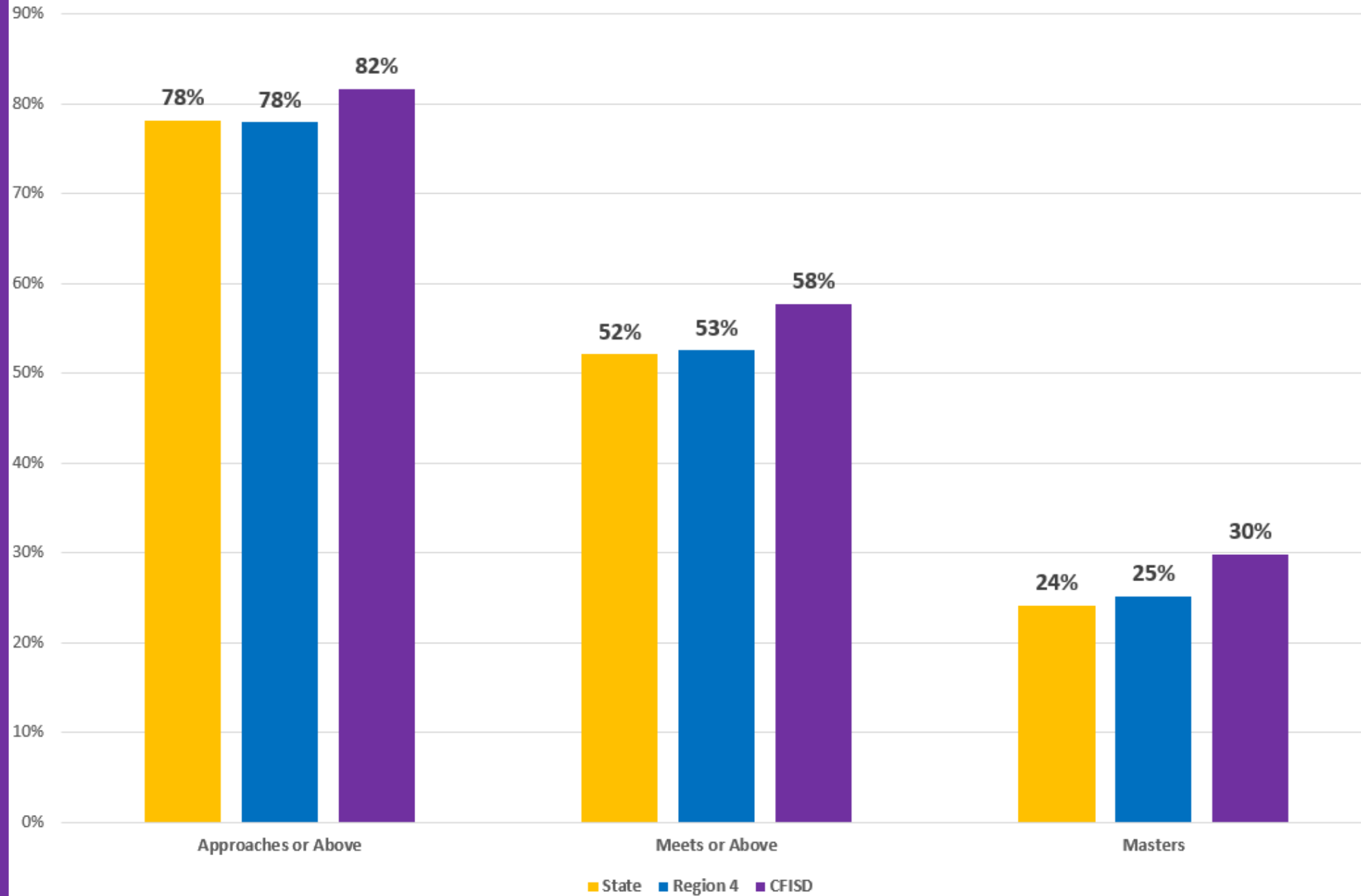

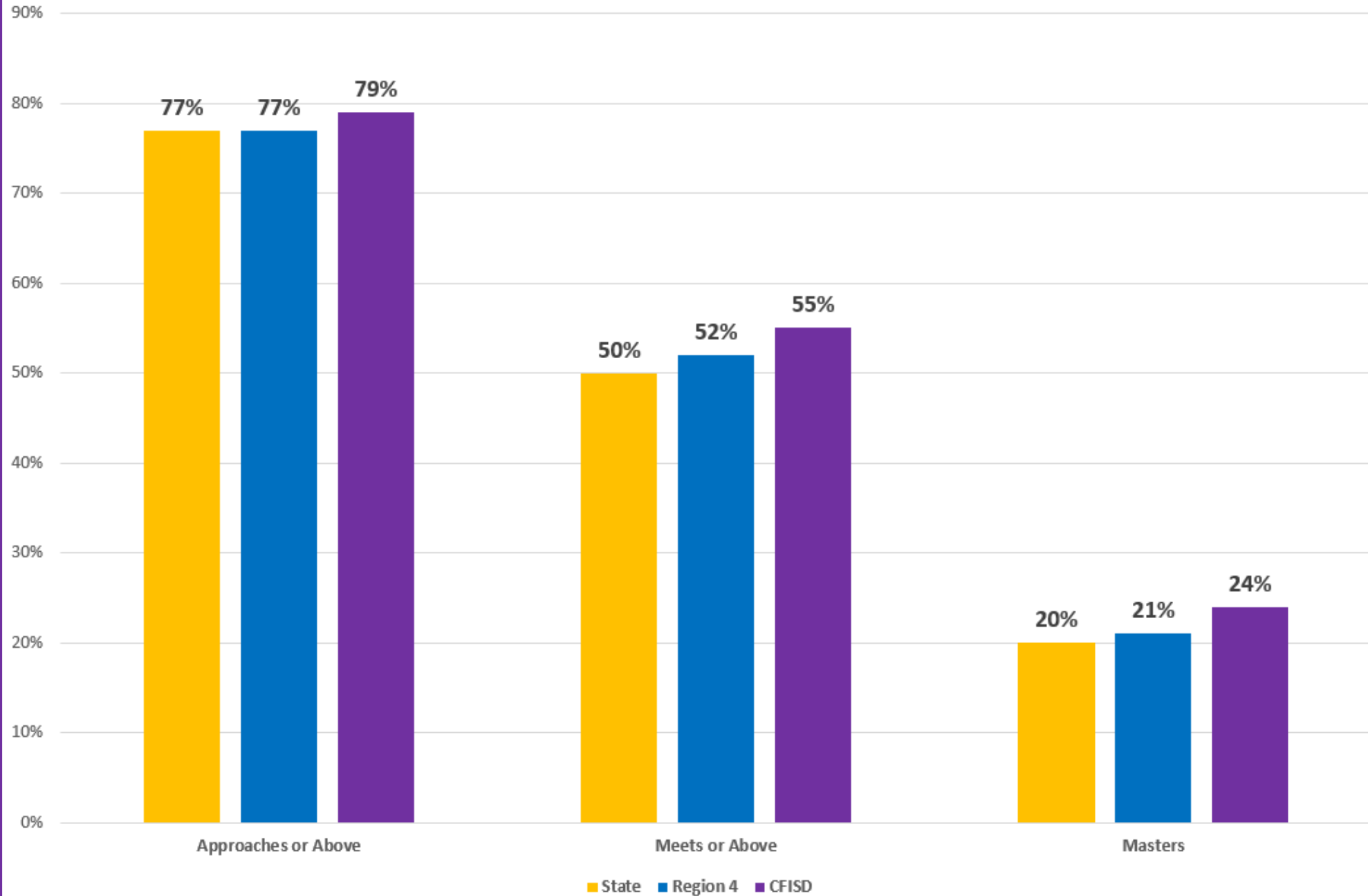

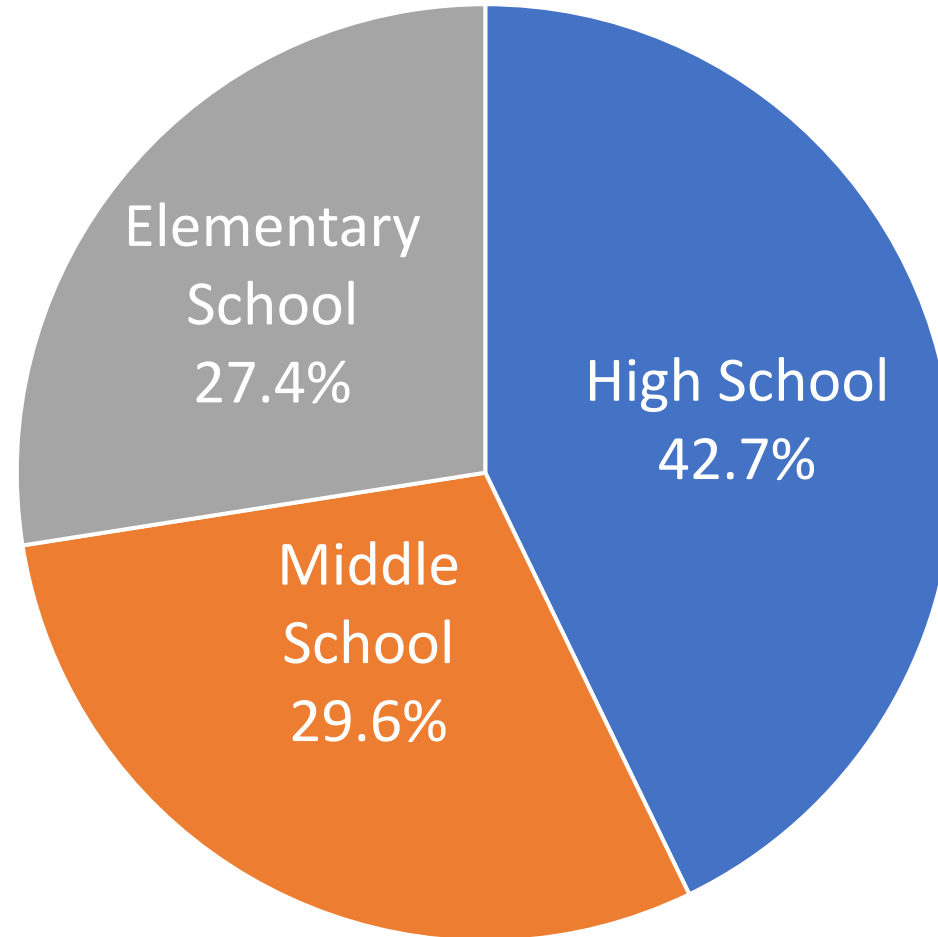

Proportional District Ratings

The state is proposing the use of a proportionality method in which each campus contributes a “weighted amount” of their rating to the overall district rating.

The proportion is based on the total number of students served in grades 3-12.



Growth will be measured differently. Students that would have shown growth based on last's year accountability, will not show growth this year.
