(3D Sculpture & Ceramics)

Scope and Sequence 2022-2023

Course Description: Art I Sculpture and Ceramics is a foundation course that uses 3D and 2D materials with an emphasis on sculpture and ceramics. Students will explore the Elements of Art and apply the Principles of Design in planning, developing and creating original works of art. While tackling creative challenges, students will study techniques, contemporary artists and art history as they make cultural connections and explore realities, relationships, and ideas. Students will develop a portfolio that demonstrates an understanding of a variety of media and problem-solving skills. One full credit (2 sequential semesters) must be earned in Art I for entry into a Level II art course.

- A student may only earn one Art I credit.
- Additional supplies and/or supply fees may be required.
